LANGUAGE ASSESSMENT – THE FIRST STEP TO LANGUAGE TRAINING

Are you a newcomer to Canada interested in learning or improving your English language Skills?

The first step to language training is to complete a formal language assessment. Funded by Citizenship and Immigration Canada and operated by Centre for Education & Training (TCET), Language Assessment Centres (LACs) administer English language assessments. Assessments are free of charge for adults with Landed Immigrant or Convention Refugee status. Assessments are conducted by certified language assessors using the Canadian Language Benchmarks, the nationally recognized standard which measures speaking, listening, reading and writing skills. Following assessments, individuals are provided with a range of language training options and

classes available in their communities, from which they can choose based on their needs and interests.
